



#### EDITORIAL

I would like to thank Richard and Peggy our volunteer distribution team for moving heaven and earth to get the last edition of the Magazine out to you. Following myself confusingly putting the wrong dates out. Absolutely wonderful. We hope you all enjoy this edition of your Magazine.

#### PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

Children are back to school and life for them and parents will take on a new order until Christmas. Through the holidays there have been various activities/clubs arranged around the village and the area to occupy time and the various open spaces, particularly the Jubilee Field have been well used. Seeing whole families there with the picnic benches being used as well as the various equipment has been very pleasing to me as one of the team that have worked to achieve it all over the past years on behalf of our residents. We are also getting visitors from adjoining towns and villages coming to use the field and the Pump Track seems to be popular for a wide area including someone I spoke to from Taunton.

Hopefully everyone is aware that Willand Parish Council should have twelve [12] Parish Councillors to look after the Parish and it's residents. At present there are only nine [9] of us and I for one have passed the 80 years mark so we do need younger blood. My age reminds me of a saying of my late father when someone asked him how a neighbour was. His reply was that 'he had one foot in the grave and the other on a bar of soap and was praying that it would not rain.' Today that may offend some, but it is a reflection of the movement of time and the attitude to many walks of life. Hopefully the positive is that by the time you read this we may well have coopted at least one more Councillor to fill one of the vacancies.

In the last magazine I outlined a number of improvements which were taking place, or being planned to improve recreational facilities within the village by using S106 monies allocated for the purpose.

The skate ramp has been completed and is being well used but the seeding of the grass banks has not worked and not been helped by users climbing up the banks to get to the platforms at the top and then launch themselves off. I have witnessed some climb to the platform and then lose their nerve and then go down the bank again. I am told that you are meant to start in the 'bowl' at the bottom and work yourself up the sides to get to the top. I watched a couple of lads do this to great effect and asked them to work to educate others as to how best use it.

The Pump Track still seems to be popular, and the behaviour of most users is encouraging. I have been told, and seen on Facebook, complimentary comments on the behaviour of a number of our young people when using the facility. They have waited for the younger ones to finish their circuit before going to do their more advanced acrobatics. Older ones have been seen helping younger ones and the input from some parents has been most welcome. It is pleasing to watch how some have developed confidence and skills from when the track was first opened.

There are two gripes we could do with some help with please.

1. Some are removing the stones from the drainage points in the centre and throwing them all around or making patterns with the stones on the grass. They are there for a purpose and the Parish have had to expend monies on buying replacement stone and also those on the grass do not do our contractors mowers a lot of good. Recently I was in the field on my invalid buggy and started picking up the stones from the grass. I was shortly joined by a Mum and Dad and their two lads who went around and picked loads and put them back where they should be. Thank you. Oh! Incidentally they were not Willand residents but from Cullompton.

2. Litter in the Jubilee Field at times is horrendous, particularly seeing the number of bins available. John, the Litter Picker goes there most days. I do know of some parents who help by clearing up when they are there; some pick up bits when they are passing through on the footpath. On a Youth Club night in July the field was being well used and there was litter everywhere and so on my buggy I stated going around picking up some of it. Before I knew it a group of older boys and girls were telling me that they would sort it and they did including 'persuading' one young man to clear up his own litter. They were a great bunch and I hope that their willingness to help continues and rubs off onto others. Thank you to all who help without having to be asked.

Quotations have been obtained for all the other play and fitness equipment I wrote about in the last magazine. The various S106 application forms have been forwarded to MDDC to release the money, but they seem to be dragging their heels again with the risk that the prices could go up or we miss a slot with the contractors. So far I am not aware of any moans about our proposals. The youngsters are looking forward to the new goal posts and a very complimentary email has been received from an adult who is looking forward to the fitness equipment planned for the Orchard Way area. Let us hope that all continues moving forward for a positive outcome.

I make my usual plea for people to cut back their hedges or shrubs to make footpaths fully useable. The hedge from Ash Close to the Esso Garage has been cut back but a trip out to the garage on my invalid buggy showed me that even now it is really too narrow and the surface in some areas is uneven and damaged. Our Neighbourhood Highways Officer from DCC was going to make arrangements for work to be done to take the hedge bottom and the grass verge back to the full width of the tarmacadam. Sadly, I have just heard that he is being moved on and so we will have to start working on the new officer. I did ask for volunteers to help as I had the tools but not the physical ability to do some of the work. We had one person who contacted the Clerk offering to help. Thank you but it needs a few more than that. At least we have finally got the potholes on the hill going down from the railway bridge repaired at last. It has come to notice that people are fly tipping garden waste around the village in the woodland or on the edge of footpaths. This should be reported to MDDC as they will investigate and remove where appropriate and if needs be issuing a fixed penalty ticket to the offender. There is really no need to do this as we have a composting site within the village, MDDC have the 'brown bin' scheme and if all else fails you can take it to the recycling centre at Ashley, Tiverton. Please do not leave it to someone else to do – if you see it report it.

For those who have loved ones buried or ashes interned in the Cemetery, or even if someone just like to go there for quiet reflection, there are now two additional benches for use which we hope will meet with approval. Other additions/improvements are in the pipeline.

The proposed Neighbourhood Plan has now been subjected to Independent Examination and some modifications have been suggested by the Inspector. Everything is now with MDDC to resolve issues with a view to moving forward to a referendum. Watch this space as they say.

The weather is going to get colder, and some will be worrying about not receiving Winter Fuel allowance if the Government go ahead with their proposals. If you have problems please do not suffer alone as there is plenty of advice and help available. Do not forget we have three District Councillors and a County Councillor who may be able to help. If they cannot do something themselves they may well have access to someone who can. There are friends and neighbours so please do not be too proud or afraid to seek help.

#### WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

Back in September it was nice to see a snippet of Willand history appear on TV during an episode of the BBC's series Who Do You Think You Are?, this one featuring Rose Ayling-Ellis, Eastenders actress and star of Strictly Come Dancing. Part of the programme focussed on Rose's great-great grandfather, James Welland, who lost his left hand whilst working for the Great Western Railway (GWR), at Tiverton Junction Railway Station in Willand (now sadly defunct, closing in 1986 in favour of the new station at Tiverton Parkway).

The Wellands were a local family, James' father having worked as a farm labourer and dairyman in neighbouring parishes. However, rather than work on the land, at the age of 19 James secured work with the GWR, which promised better pay and more job security, albeit at the price of long hours and often, as he was to find out to his cost, dangerous working conditions. It was only the second day of his employment when, on 10 May 1899, he was out moving signal lamps between the 'up and down' lines and took a backwards step, "at the same moment a goods train from Paddington to Exeter was slowly entering the station unseen by Welland, who was struck by the engine and knocked down. He appears to have instinctively put out his hands to save himself, and his left hand going on the metal [was] run over and completely crushed" (Devon & Somerset News). The stationmaster, John Hunt, sent him straight to the infirmary in Tiverton by special train, where it proved impossible to save his left hand. His injuries were later described as, "severe blow and shock to the system from collision; left hand very severely crushed, all the fingers hanging by strips of skin, and rendering amputation halfway up the arm necessary; right hand also much bruised, and one finger partly dislocated; injury to forehead, which was cut to the bone about three inches long; unconsciousness for more than two hours; and bruises to arms" (Devon & Somerset News).

This was an era before significant health and safety measures were introduced, and James would not have received any relevant safety training, just shown the job and left to get on with it; risk assessments were unheard of. Working on the railways remained incredibly risky: in 1899, the year of James' accident, 15,582 railway workers were injured and 584 killed in the United Kingdom. The GWR admitted liability for James' accident and promised to pay him 7 shilling 6 pence per week – half of his 15 shillings weekly wage – for the period he was totally incapacitated and out to work. However, James wanted £250 compensation, about £33,000 in today's prices, so he engaged a local solicitor and took the case to arbitration under the terms of the recent Workmen's Compensation Act. GWR were unwilling to go beyond their legal obligations, and the judge hearing the case at Tiverton County Court ruled in their favour, adding that he thought the company had behaved 'very fairly'. The case also failed at the Court of Appeal, leaving James with daunting legal costs.

In time, James was provided with a prosthetic hand, and he was able to get work as an insurance agent, probably selling policies and collecting payments in the local area. The 1901 census records show that he was then living in Willand with his mother, who was widowed not long before his accident, in Railway Terrace on Station Road, the end house next to the Railway Hotel (this end of the terrace, along with the hotel, were demolished to make way for the M5 motorway). As well as James, his mother and one of his sisters, his home was also occupied by no less than six lodgers, all of them young men aged 19 to 25 and working for GWR at Tiverton Junction. No doubt this made for a busy home at times, but it would have brought in much-needed income for the Wellands. We know that the during the early twentieth century there was a severe housing shortage in Willand, with little resolution until the building of Park Street in the 1920s.

At some stage between 1901 and 1904, James left Willand, and the BBC programme followed his subsequent life in Exeter, working in different jobs, struggling to make ends meet, including a brush with bankrupts, and struggling to find a home for his every-growing family – he and his wife, Ada, had 12 children. They eventually found some stability when, in the 1930s, they became beneficiaries of fresh obligations put on the local council to provides houses for poorer families, plus the interwar drive to build 'decent homes for the working classes' and were re-housed in one of the new council houses on Widgery Road, on the Polsloe Estate, Whipton, where James lived until his death in 1947, aged 66. So, if you get the chance to see a repeat of Rose Ayling-Ellis's edition of Who Do You Think You Are?, or are able to view it on the internet, it is well worth a watch. And in the meantime, we await the next celebrity national or global to claim a link to Willand: there's bound to be a few.

#### WILLAND COMMUNITY COMPOSTING SCHEME (WCCS)

WCCS members would like to take this opportunity to add our tribute to those already paid to the late Tony Mander, in recognition of all his work as WCCS Secretary and Treasurer for 20 years and, as his successor worded it, "for handing over everything in such good order." Tony was a well-loved member of the team, and his enthusiasm, dedication and sense of fun will be sadly missed by everyone. Some readers may not know that WCCS was born as a result of the 1998 Parish Appraisal and took several years to establish, largely due to the commitment and hard work of only 7 volunteers. The WCCS site has developed considerably since those early days and if you've not visited before, please call in to see what we do. WCCS would not run without a small team of dedicated volunteers, and we'd love to welcome some new faces (and pairs of hands) to join us.

In May we opened an extra session, on Monday evenings, and have been very pleased with the uptake of Monday evening deposits from villagers as well as the increase in visitors to the site since our Spring/Summer publicity campaign. The green waste has been flowing in from residents and sales of the resulting compost are well ahead of last year's figures. "THANK YOU" for your continued support.

In real terms, our August shredding session took over 4 hours, compared to 90 minutes for our April shredding session! Our volunteers will be working hard through the Autumn to turn this material into bagged compost for the community to buy. With the darker nights approaching our Monday evening sessions came to a stop on

9<sup>th</sup> September but we will look to reintroduce them in the Spring. Please keep any eye out in this Magazine and at the site for updates. In the meantime, here's a quick summary of the **What, When, Where** and **Who**:

**WHAT... TO BRING:** We accept most **Green Garden Waste and for FREE:** fresh grass (kept separate please), hedge clippings, pruning's (no more than 1 inch thick), plus flowers, vegetables, plants, leaves and turfs (again kept separate please).

We are **unable to accept** Cordyline and Palm leaves as they cause issues with the shredding machine.

**PLEASE NOTE**: we also ask that excess soil is removed from your green waste and that <u>all</u> "foreign bodies" such as labels, stones, pet poo, plant pots, wire, metal stakes\*, etc are excluded. (\*Yes, a large metal rod was found in material during the last shredding session which could have caused a very nasty accident if it had gone undetected through the machinery).

WHAT... TO BUY: Sieved compost (with next to no twigs) @ £2.50/bag; unsieved waste @ £2.50/wheelbarrow.
