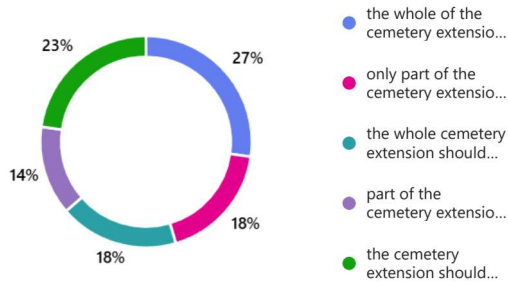


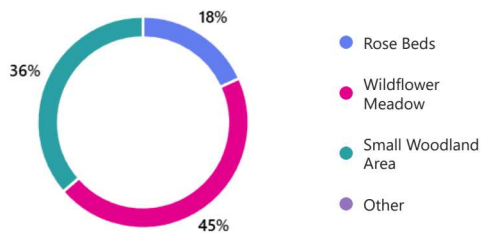
Responses Overview Active

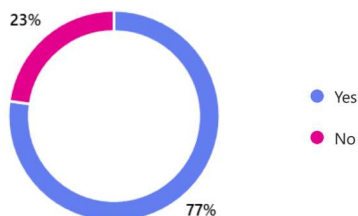

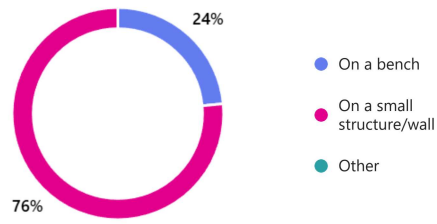
